



Introduction to Computers for Seniors

Senior computers is in its twentieth year of operation. It came into existence as an auxiliary of the SAGE Society to introduce seniors to the magic and convenience of computers. It also serves to titillate the brain's gray cells and keep them active. The university provides a computer lab twice a year, usually in July and January, when there are no regular classes in session. The class is conducted by volunteers, (not all SAGE members) who enjoy turning on the bright lights of computer fun.

The first class begins Friday, January 7 from 10 am to 12 noon and meet for six Fridays through February 11, 2011. Students are taught how to turn on the machine, create documents, save and edit them using Microsoft Word 2007. The fifth lesson guides participants to the pleasures of e-mail and the final lesson is devoted to the mysteries of the internet.
